




Speaker Profiles



2020 Opening Keynote Thursday, October 8 12:00 noon - 12:45 pm



Helen has been at the forefront of improvement and transformational change for years. She will reflect on how primary care can lead during difficult times and how powerful social movement can be in affecting health and social system change.

Helen has been supporting quality improvement within the National Health Service in England for nearly 30 years. She has led and facilitated many nationwide initiatives to improve care, including in cancer services, urgent and emergency care, services for people living with dementia and care in the community.

Helen has demonstrated a constancy of purpose and resilience to stay within the system over the years that is rare in internal change agents. She has managed to keep learning, growing and delivering change. Over time, her focus has shifted from managing big programmes of change to approaches that mobilise and build energy and commitment to change on a very large scale.

Helen has an ability to connect directly with thousands of frontline staff and patient leaders. She is one of the top social influencers in healthcare globally, reaching more than a million people each month through her social media connections, virtual presentations, commentaries, and blogs.



Minister's Address Thursday, October 8, 2:30 pm

Speaker: Deputy Premier and Minister of Health Hon. Christine Elliott

As a mother, lawyer, businesswoman, and entrepreneur, Christine Elliott knows how to bring people together. She knows the importance of balancing a family budget and how to manage a successful business.

Christine graduated from the University of Western Ontario with a Bachelor of Laws degree. She then built a successful career in business and law, working first as an auditor at one of Canada's largest banks. Christine later co-founded a law firm with her late husband Jim Flaherty, where she specialized in real estate, corporate law, and estate law. Christine has worked tirelessly to help businesses all across the province expand and thrive.

Christine also used her business and legal expertise to pursue her commitment to public service. Her pro bono legal work for charitable organizations gained her the recognition as a Rotary International Paul Harris Fellow, the highest award with Rotary.

As well, Christine is a co-founder of the Abilities Centre in Whitby, a facility built with the vision of celebrating all people, regardless of ability. The centre has become a hub of its community, hosting various Parapan Am Games events in 2015.

In 2006, Christine was elected MPP. She has won five elections, and for nine years has served the people of Ontario at Queen's Park, including six years as Deputy Leader of the PC Party. In 2016, Christine became Ontario's Patient Ombudsman, where she fought for better access to health care for all.

She currently serves as the Deputy Premier of Ontario, Minister of Health and is the MPP for Newmarket-Aurora. Christine has triplet sons, John, Galen and Quinn.

Q & A with Matt Anderson On-Demand-released Thursday, October 8, 2020

Speaker: Matt Anderson, President and CEO, Ontario Health

Matt will speak to his vision for primary care and how interprofessional primary care teams fit in Ontario Health's mandate.

Matthew Anderson is an experienced health care leader, teambuilder and advocate for positive change. He is widely respected across Ontario's health care system for his intense focus on the needs and experiences of patients and caregivers. Before joining Ontario Health, Matthew was President and CEO of Lakeridge Health, one of the largest community hospital systems in the province. He led the operation of five hospitals with four emergency departments and more than 5,000 physicians and staff, working with community partners to build a regional system of care for families in the Durham Region.

At Ontario Health, Matthew is leading one of the largest mergers in healthcare history bringing together 20 agencies and over 12,000 staff.

Matthew began his career in data analytics and IT and has risen quickly through the ranks. He became Chief Information Officer of University Health Network (UHN) in 1998, and a Vice President at UHN in 2000. In 2008, he was named CEO of the Toronto Central Local Health Integration Network and in 2010, became CEO of William Osler Health System.

Jane Philpott is delighted to be the new Dean of the Faculty of Health Sciences at Queen's University and the CEO of SEAMO. She is a medical doctor and former Member of Parliament.

Prior to politics, Jane was a family doctor for 30 years and spent the first decade of her career in Niger, West Africa. She was Chief of Family Medicine at Markham Stouffville Hospital and an Associate Professor in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Toronto. From 2015 to 2019 she served as federal Minister of Health, Minister of Indigenous Services, President of the Treasury Board and Minister of Digital Government. She has recently been appointed as the Ministers' Special Advisor for the Ontario Health Data Platform.
