Expanding Access to Team Based Care for International Agricultural Workers



in Norfolk, Brant, and Haldimand Counties

~6000 International Agricultural Workers (IAW's) work in Norfolk County each year.
Our base population increases by 8%.

Access to IAW Health Care has improved with the hiring of 2 FT Nurse Practitioners
in 2023 and the addition of a second mobile clinic in 2024.

**Mission - to provide holistic, patient-centred, accessible health care
that promotes client autonomy and overall well-being.**

Collaborative multi-disciplinary care continues with Physicians, Translators,
Community Outreach Workers, Medical Office Assistants, and
Leadership at NFHT, GRCHC, and HFHT.

Clinics operate more than 60 hours/week for 6months/year at 4 locations.

Two mobile clinics are active at farms 3 nights/week.

Clinics remain open 50 hours/week on the shoulder and winter season.

Workers attend clinics from as far away as 65km.

Meaningful patient interactions have increased by 76% from Q1 2023 to Q1 2024.

Quantitative improvements also in patient outcomes-

Hypertension, Glycemic Control, Cholesterol, and preventative screening.

Continuity of care has improved.
